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## MULTIMEDIA TODAY! BY REV FRANCIS KHOO



oday, we are in that time spoken of in Daniel 12:4, "...even to the time of the end: many shall run to and fro, and knowledge shall be increased." In the last century, we have seen how the world has become "smaller" and more globally connected.

Time Magazine in their February 2011 cover feature article, shared a mind-boggling concept known as 'Singularity'. The article explores and predicts that at one point in time, artificial intelligence will exceed


human intelligence in such a quantum that human existence, as we know it, will be changed forever! It suggested that by 2045, "... given the vast increases in computing power and the vast reductions in the cost of the same, the quantity of artificial intelligence created will be about a billion times the sum of all the human intelligence that exists today." However, certain things will remain unchanged. One is that "all have sinned and come short of the glory of God". Further, that no form of human wisdom, science, technology or even artificial intelligence can change the condition of the human heart and its separateness from God. With the purchase of a high-speed duplication machine we started making cassette tapes. Then in 2001, we start to produce CDs with the purchase of a CD duplicator.

It was in 2003 that the God started to lay on our hearts a vision to use audio and video multimedia as a platform to extend Covenant Vision's

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evangelistic, teaching, preaching, equipping and healing ministry through content that can be transmitted over the internet. We realized that this media includes text, audio, video, and graphics. In this the foundation was laid for our Infocomm Department with a vision to have our own design, layout and graphic facilities. In 2004, Covenant Vision

Multimedia Ministry was established with the launch of www. covenantvision.org.

A Media Centre was subsequently added to the website so that people could access our audio and video recordings via streaming. We also began to recognise in this age of rapidly evolving and growing information technology, there is a need to be on the cutting age of technology. So when we moved in 2015 to new premises, a decision was made to upgrade all our audio and video facilities with digital equipment. The cost has not been small, but



we realised the urgency of the times and seasons to be that "living bridge to reach a lost and needy world".

Looking forward to stay connected with you in this exciting Digital Age of information technology to continue unapologetically pointing people to the One who said, "I am the way, the truth and the life" (John 14:6).







## RETURN TO MAURITIUS BY BRO NG WEE BENG & ANNIE TAN

ovenant Vision's relationship with the Anglican Diocese of Mauritius began when Ps Kenny Chong first mentioned Rev Francis' name to Rev Eric Mafat. The initial contact was followed by a trip to Singapore by Rev Eric with an invitation from Bishop Ian Ernest, who was also then the Vicar of St Paul's.

As Rev Francis was seeking the Lord on how to respond to this invitation, in an open vision, he saw a mountainous island with a dark cloud hanging over it. Then a bright, glowing and shining cloud, radiating

lightning flashes, came above the dark cloud. A hand emerge from the bright cloud and the dark cloud was dispersed. An audible voice then said, "I am going to start a revival in Mauritius, do you want to be part of it?" Rev Francis's answer was an obvious "Yes!". Meantime, God had already given the word to various people in Mauritius that God was going to start a revival in Mauritius through the Anglican Church and that a Chinese Evangelist was coming.

In September 2004, Rev Francis and Ps Shirley led the first CVC team of 13

to Mauritius. There was to be a 3-day teaching seminar at St Paul's and 3 nights of TOUCH JESUS, HE HEALS! Rallies conducted in a big tent pitched on the grounds of St James Cathedral. This was followed in August 2005, with a CVC team of 13 and in August 2006 with another CVC team of 14. Over the 3 years, much fruit was recorded with thousands responding to the various altar calls. Glory to Jesus!

Last year as St Paul's celebrated its 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, Rev Francis was asked to write a greeting in St Paul's Anniversary

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Magazine. It was in the course of doing so that Rev Francis was given a clear word to accept Rev Eric Mafat's invitation

A CVC team, led by Rev Francis and Ps Shirley Khoo, consisting of Sis Annie Tan, Sis Catherine Lim. Sis Chia Guat Hoon, Sis Christie Tan, Sis Hannah Faith Lau, Sis Irene Lim, Sis Jenny How, Dr Kathleen Hee, Sis Michelle Lim, Sis Stella Heng, Dr Denis Cheong, Bro Jeffrey Lee, Bro Eddy Woo and Bro Ng Wee Beng was then formed. There was to be prayer and fasting, as the team members were preparing. Finally, team members, families and friends gathered at Changi Airport on the morning of August 4th.

When we boarded the Air Mauritius plane, Rev Francis was met and greeted by name by the Flight Purser, Bro Michel Bigaignon. Then he



surprised us all by saying to Rev Francis, "I heard you were coming to Mauritius and I was praying that you would be on this flight!" Apparently he was touched and saved in the 2004 meetings. Right from that point, the tone of the whole trip was set. We were not only made to feel welcome, but it was like a sense of "homecoming".

We finally landed at Sir Seewoosagur Ramgoolam (SSR) airport where we were warmly received by Rev Eric Mafat and his team of volunteer transporters from St Paul's Church. They were all familiar to Rev Francis and Ps Shirley, so it was really like a time of homecoming as this warm reception was extended to all team members. Then it was off to Voila Bagatelle Hotel for a quick check-in before going

to a Chinese Restaurant.
Archbishop Ian Ernest was waiting for us with the other Pastors, Church Leaders and some members of St Paul's. The welcome and fellowship was so warm that even team members who have never been to Mauritius felt that like we were among old friends.

The pattern for our time in Mauritius was set the next day with a time of morning devotions followed by breakfast. The transport team with their cars was waiting for us and we were brought for an outing on a glass bottom boat. Despite the rain forecasted that day, we found favor as God held it till late afternoon. After that, we were treated to a scrumptious homecooked meal at the home of Bro Jean Jacques, a St Paul's Church member. Then there was to be some

more sightseeing for the team, while Rev Francis and Rev Eric went off to visit Ps Paul Cheong who was recuperating from a fall. Finally we gathered together again in the dining hall of St Paul's Church. where we hosted to another 'home-cooked' meal. Then was a time of praying as we interceded and prayed together with the brethren from St Paul's. That night there was a Leaders' Seminar by Rev Francis. In spite of being away from home and feeling a bit tired, we felt strangely at home with all home-cooked meals and the warm friendship.

The next morning, accompanied by some Church leaders and members, we were brought to SSR Botanic Gardens. There we had a picnic with home cooked food. As we fellowshipped and worshipped together, the ducks and swans also joined

us! On our way back to the hotel, the bus took us for a short tour with a short stop over by a beach. The remaining afternoon was spent in our hotel, preparing for the teaching, preaching and sharing to come.

That evening, we fellowshipped with a cell group over dinner at a cafe, operated by couple. The love of the brethren was evident when they celebrated the birthday of a young widow-mother. During and after dinner, Rev Francis and Rev Eric ministered to some cell members individually whilst we fellowship with the rest of their cell group. We had such a sensing of a strong family bond, with lots of love and care amongst the cell members!

The next morning, after intercession at St Paul's, we started the "Destiny for Glory" Conference with the

2 morning sessions by Rev Francis. Soon after lunch at church, Dr Denis shared at the afternoon session. Finally we headed back to our hotel for a short break as well as to prepare for that night's TOUCH JESUS, HE HEALS! (TJHH) Rally.

That evening, we had an awesome time of intercession at the Church. Then we were served wholesome soup prepared by Sis Jaclyn, wife of Rev Eric. Tents in preparation for an overflow had been erected in the car park of St Paul's. After worship, Sis Michelle and a Mauritian sister shared their testimonies. Rev Francis then shared the word, with Rev Eric interpreting. More than a thousand came that evening with many salvations and healings recorded! Finally, the meeting ended and we were hosted to another home cooked meal. Then the long





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day ended with us returning to our hotel in high spirits.

The next morning, after an intense time of intercession, Rev Francis taught at the 2 sessions that ended the Destiny Conference. In the afternoon, the ladies went on to a Women's Ministry Meeting with Dr Kathleen sharing. The men went to a Men's Ministry Meeting with Dr Denis sharing, while the 'younger' ones joined the Youth Ministry Meeting with Sis Michelle and Sis Hannah Faith sharing.

In that evening's TJHH evening rally, Bishop Roger Jaomalaza Chung, Bishop of Diocese of Madagascar graced the rally. After Praise and Worship, Sis Annie and Bro Wee Beng shared

their testimonies. Then Rev Francis shared the good news. After that we were really swamped as we had more coming up for prayers then the previous night.

It finally ended at past midnight and we then had supper prepared by another cell group. We were hungry and really enjoyed the meal, as we did not have dinner, the time having been spent in prayer and intercession. The cell members even stayed back to help clean up after we left! We were really touched by the amazing servant hood hearts of Rev Eric, his wife and their Church members!

The next day was a Sunday, which began even earlier then usual. There was to be a 7.15 am Service with Bro Jeffrey sharing the word. Then at the 9.15 am Service, Rev Francis ministered. Concurrently at the same time, there was also a Youth Service with Dr Denis as the speaker. At 11 am, there was a Hakka Dialect Service at which Sis Catherine shared whilst Bro Jeffrey translated.

The last TJHH rally began earlier at 3pm. After the Praise and Worship, Sis Catherine and 2 local brethren shared testimonies. After Rev Francis preached, many responded to the altar calls and all team members were kept busy ministering and praying for those that responded. Praise God for the signs and miracles that confirmed the preaching of the word!

Upon checkout, we were brought to another Chinese Restaurant and hosted to a 'tim sum' lunch by Bro Ian and Sis Natalie. Then we adjourned to their beautiful home. We had a tremendous time of sharing and awesome time of personal prayer ministry. The precious couple rededicated their lives and

renewed their vows to Jesus and blessing of their home. Time just seemed to pass so quickly and eventually we had to part. Rev Eric and his faithful team of transporters sent us to the airport. After many hugs and a closing prayer we boarded the flight home. It is apparent that this church is being blessed by the love and care poured out by the leading and living examples of their unpretentious senior pastor and his supportive wife!





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## MAKE ROOM FOR GOD BY REV WILFRED PNG





hat is prayer? I love to speak of prayer with these four words: "Make Room for God". In prayer, I make room for God to work in me and through me because of what He has already worked for me through the finished work of Christ.

Someone once asked me to define prayer in 2 words. I replied, "Prayer works!" In 3 words? "Prayer changes me." In 4 words? "Make room for God."

#### What happens when you make room for God?

1) Faith is conceived. Romans 10:17 tells us that faith comes; and it comes by hearing the Word of God.

George Muller was concerned about the welfare of the many orphans in the streets of Bristol, England. This was in the 1800s. One day in his prayer time, it seemed that God spoke to him in Psalm 81:10 "Open your mouth wide, and I will fill it." He asked God for a sum of money

to do something about the orphans. Shortly after that he received 50 pounds (quite a sum of money in 1800s). That began his journey to house the orphans. The rest is history. Indeed, faith is conceived in prayer.

#### 2) God's will and purpose are perceived.

Philippians 2:13 tells us that it is God who is at work in us revealing His will and enabling us to carry it out.

Martin Luther, the great reformer received a letter from his co-worker that he was deliriously sick. He responded in a reply along this line: "Do not let me hear that you are dying. I still have need of you in the work of reforming the church. You shall live and out-live me. This is my will and let my will be done, because I only seek the glory of God." When the letter reached his co-worker who was in another city, he was at the point of death. But when the letter was read to him, strength surged into his body and he recovered to continue the work. He died two months after the death of Luther. Indeed, because

Luther was always in touch with God through prayer, he knew the will and purposes of 1800s, who became God concerning the work of the ministry God had called him to.

3) God's wisdom and enablement are received.

How we need wisdom - the ability to live life skilfully. How we need His favour and enabling to do His work effectively.

Pastor Hsi was a Confucian scholar, in China in the addicted to opium. In his early forties, he met the Lord and was filled with His Spirit. His life-work began in helping other addicts break free from their opium addiction. He believed in prayer and the use of medicine. However, because of the opium wars between China and England, medicine was in short supply. He sought God for wisdom and enablement to concoct a pill from his knowledge of herbs. During his time of fasting and prayer, he received the understanding. Consequently, his work expanded unhindered, not having to rely on foreign supply. Indeed, God's wisdom and enablement are received in prayer.

## DISCIPLESHIP GROUPS BY REV WILFRED PNG



couple who were new to the church asked, "Do you have a cell group that we may attend." "Yes! We have 9 Discipleship groups," was the reply from a DG leader.

What is a Discipleship group? Discipleship Group or DG in short is the nomenclature for small group meetings in our church.

Where do they meet? In homes in these localities: Bukit Timah, Ang Mo Kio, Upper Thomson, Punggol, Kovan, Balestier,

East Coast, Clarke Quay

and Dakota. There are nine venues in total.

How often do they meet? They meet once a week, three times in a month. The church has a monthly corporate prayer meeting on the first Monday of the month. DG stands down on that week.

#### Who leads the meeting?

Our DG leaders are couples. They all have their secular jobs.

What do they study or discuss at the meeting? Since April 2014, they have been studying and

discussing the book by Dr Neil Anderson entitled "Victory over the darkness." The essence of this study is to know who you are in Christ. The spirit of the believer is made alive in Christ when he is born again. His spiritual identity is in Christ. Knowing this truth, he endeavours by the grace of God to live out his life by faith in accordance to the truth of the Word in the power of the Holy Spirit. This would require an incremental and progressive restoration of the soul meaning the mind must be renewed, the emotions must be managed and the will must be re-aligned with the identity he has in Christ. Consequently, the words of his mouth and the actions of his behaviour may reflect Christ-likeness in all his interactions with people. They can't see his spirit or soul. They can only see his body. They need to see that his body is the temple of the Holy Spirit. They need to see that he is different. He has a character that reflects God. He has substance and has an influence in the world.

How long is the meeting and what else takes place? The meeting is usually 2 hours, but may proceed to 3. There is worship, prayers and dinner/refreshments.

Bonding amongst the members are important, therefore the groups initiate activities outside of the regular meeting – activities like cycling, touring or dinner. Members of the DG are involved in providing refreshments after the Sunday service. This happens twice a year. They serve at our monthly healing service by turn (once every 9 months). And DG Leaders come together periodically for fellowship with other ministry leaders and pastors.

They include lessons on prayer, worship, learning to hear God's voice, being led by the Holy Spirit, operating in the gifts of the Holy, understanding dreams and visions and even prophecy.

The children are also taught to realise that Christianity is

The ministry is also blessed with a team of intercessors who faithfully intercede for children, parents and teachers. In response, we have seen children being baptised in the Holy Spirit and receive the gift of tongues, seeing visions and prophesying. We trust and believe that children are fully capable of experiencing His Spirit just like adults. Joel 2:28 reminds us, "And it shall come to pass afterward that I will pour out My Spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your

old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions."

In these last days, we believe that God is preparing to raise children up to be His kings and priests for His kingdom.

Firestarters also adhere to the belief that the responsibility of disciplining children lies primarily with the parents. However, we recognise the responsibility that the Church and the Christian community have in supporting parents. Parents are therefore connected and updated through weekly emails outlining what was taught so they can reinforce the lessons taught at home.

Parenting is a journey and we as a church community connect with each other not only on Sundays but also support each other on weekdays via a Whatsapp parents' group chat for prayers, encouragement and updates for urgent help. 

## THE PULPIT MINISTRY

ehemiah tells us that as they were rebuilding Jerusalem, a hunger came upon the people for the word of God. They then asked Ezra to read the Law of Moses unto them. Nehemiah 8:4 then tells us that Ezra stood upon "a pulpit of wood, which they had made for the purpose". This is the only time in the Bible the word "pulpit" is used.

However, the pulpit referred to was no simple block of wood. It was a huge rostrum large enough to accommodate Ezra as well as 6 others standing on his right and with 7 others standing on his left. Basically it was so big that it accommodated Ezra and 13 Priests with tasked with a role to help "...the people to understand the law". Here was where "...they read distinctly from the book, in the law of God, and they gave the sense, and helped them to understand the reading." Hence, pulpit preaching was conceived!

Today a definite need for pulpit preaching continues! However, more and more believers shun pulpit preaching for other forms of specialised ministry. This has resulted in pulpits being robbed of great talented preachers. In fact, the role of the pulpit minister has been somewhat deemphasised in recent times, as the Church of Christ has placed more and more emphasis on worship, music, dance and other forms of personal performance ministry.

Perhaps, we have not fully understood the important role of the preacher in the process of building up the body. In Covenant Vision, we believe that pulpit preaching is perhaps the most important single factor that exposes the congregation to a Christian personality in a more powerful way than almost any other means of evangelism. Word-based, Spirit-led and Faith-filled messages, when preached dynamically, allows the hearers to see the Christ who lives in the heart of the preacher.

Over the years, we have jealously guarded the pulpit ministry of Covenant Vision. We have adhered to what the Apostle Paul had emphasised in Romans 1:16. In this, we recognised the need for pulpit preachers who are "not ashamed of the gospel of

Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone who believeth"! In this, pulpit preaching must be centred around what the Apostle Paul declared, "....we preach Christ crucified...For we preach not ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord."

With this in mind, we prayerfully sought the Lord to guide and lead us in building our pulpit ministry. Also for the Holy Spirit to lead to us, ministers who would be preachers with the Jeremiah 20:9 passion: having the word of God in their heart "...like a burning fire shut up in their bones"!

The Lord has truly answered our prayers. Besides the anointed inhouse ministers, we have been blessed with many Word-based, Spirit-led and Faith-filled preachers that brought fiery Christ-centred messages. Indeed these preachers have met the strict criteria that the Lord gave us that "... we cannot preach it if we have not first lived it!"



children, I was hesitant to


